Amelia Earhart Fellowship Program

The idea behind the program is to advance the status of women through encouragement and financial support of women pursuing PHD or doctoral degrees in aerospace related sciences or aerospace related engineering. The Fellowships, established in 1938 as a living memorial to Zontian and aviator Amelia Earhart, encourage women to expand their career options beyond traditional boundaries.

Since the inception of the program in 1938 there have been more than 1438 fellowships totaling more than USD 8, 6 million given to 1014 Fellows from 70 countries.
