District Goals 2016-2018

The district board for the biennium 2016-2018 took office at Convention in Nice in July.

The board members are Ingibjörg Elíasdóttir, governor, Dorte Olesen, It. governor, Berit Birkelund, treasurer, Lisbeth Løvenov, AD Denmark, Viduta Bačkierienė, AD Lithuania, Lára G. Hansdóttir, AD Iceland, Mari Ramsten Vangdal, AD Norge and Helena G. Bjarnadóttir, secretary. The board held it's first meeting in Lithuania on May 1st, after attending a joint meeting of the outgoing and the incoming boards of district 13. The board held it's second meeting on September 2nd in Oslo. That meeting was in connection with the area meeting in area four, Norway, which the members of the board also attended. The goals for the biennium are in accordance with the Zonta International biennium goals, adopted at convention, covering the five areas of advocacy, service, membership, resources and the centennial anniversary. We will keep on working on preventing violence against women through education; areas and clubs continue the campaign Zonta Says No to Violence Against Women; men will be engaged as partners for gender equality; we will engage the next generation of gender equality advocates; clubs recruit and retain committed and skilled members; leadership training and membership knowledge will be reinforced; donations to ZIF will be increased and we will establish a Centennial Anniversary Committee.

International Liaison

News from Areas

Area four, Norway, had a very successful area meeting in the beginning of September. The district board attended the meeting. It was very informative and district four is vibrant and successful in advancing the status of women.

Area one, Denmark, also had a successful area meeting late in September. In Denmark there was a big fundraising event at *Hofteatret* in September, where around 140 people, Zontians as well as non-Zontians, were entertained by artists performing on a very old stage in the castle of Christiansborg. The artists performed for free and the profit of the event went to the organization *Danner huset*, which is a crisis center for women who have suffered violence.

Clubs in area three, Iceland, participated in an event on October 24th where attention was drawn to the gender-pay gap and other discrimination against women. Women in Iceland left work early that day and participated in rallies in different places in the country. A press release from Zonta in Iceland and likeminded organizations was sent out that day, demanding equal pay now.

Membership Updates

At convention in Nice a new membership category was introduced; *Young Professional Members*. Clubs are encouraged to look into recruiting members in this category; professionals under the age of 30. More information on this new category will be on the ZI website.

The ZI board has decided that clubs may now charter with 15 members, instead of 20; although, they are encouraged to build membership numbers.

Total membership of Zonta as of September 30th is 26.175. To reach ZI's goal of 5% increase by May 31st 2018 membership has to increase by 4.986 members worldwide. District 13 keeps working on increasing the membership in the district and the board has made the membership committee stronger with more members on the committee.

Young Women in Public

Affairs

Thit Hammerich Clausen from Slagelse in Denmark received the District 13 Young Women in Public Affairs (YWPA) award. The award recognizes young women ages 16-19 for demonstrating leadership skills and



commitment to public service and civic causes, and encourages them to continue their participation in public and political life.
